



Rajiv Gandhi Kisan Nyay Yojana

Named after 'Bharat Ratna', former Prime Minister Shri Rajiv Gandhi Kisan Nyay Yojana is focused on providing a comprehensive solution to problems faced by farmers.

About 70 percent of Chhattisgarh's population is dependent on agriculture for its livelihood. Rapidly changing climate and unpredictable rainfall had negative impact on crop production resulting lower income for the farmers. Increasing agricultural input cost like -improved seeds, fertilizers, pesticides and modern agricultural equipments for good crop yield- was another challenge they faced.

Identifying these problems Chhattisgarh government launched 'Rajiv Gandhi Kisan

Nyay Yojana' on May 21, 2020 which was implemented retrospectively from year 2019. Under this scheme farmers get subsidy on the agriculture input cost. It is helping farmers to arrange better agriculture facilities.

Under the scheme farmers producing all major Kharif and horticulture crops receive input subsidy of Rs. 9,000 per acre annually. Input subsidy of Rs 10,000 per year is also given to a farmer if they opt to cultivate Kodo-Kutki (millet), Sugarcane, Arhar (pigeon pea), Maize, Soybean, Pulses, Oilseeds, Fragrant Paddy, other fortified paddy, Papaya or do plantation in the area on which the farmer has sold paddy at the minimum support price in year 2020-21. Farmers doing timber or fruit plantation will receive subsidy for three years.



The input subsidies are paid in the account of beneficiary through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT). Chhattisgarh is doing highest DBT transfers in framers' account across India.

There has been a significant increase in the number of farmers, acreage, and crop productivity as compared to the year 2017-18. Be-

sides, it has brought prosperity to the lives of farmers. Since the year 2018-19, the state has been creating new records every year in paddy procurement. In the year 2022-23, record-breaking 107.53 lakh metric ton of paddy was procured. In the year 2022-23 record breaking 107.53 lakh metric tons of paddy was procured and ₹2067 cr was paid to the farmers.

Godhan Nyay Yojana

This scheme was created to increase the income of the cattle rearing farmers and protect the Rabi and Kharif crops from open grazing.

It also aims to encourage the use of cow dung organic fertilizer and reduce the use of chemical fertilizers. Along with generating employment for rural populace, this scheme has helped improving soil fertility, boost the availability of unadulterated organic agricultural produce and provide food and shelter for livestock.

The Gauthan committees so far have purchased 103.25 lakh quintals cow-dung from cattle rearing farmers in the state. Farmers earned Rs 206.49 crore by selling cow-dung.

Compost Revolution:

The production and use of Vermi-compost from made through cow dung under this scheme has started a new revolution in the Chhattisgarh. It is emerging as new alternative to the chemical fertilizer which is already in short supply. Gauthan committees and Women Self Help Group associated with Gau-

than were paid Rs 179.11 Crore so far.

Super-compost & Compost

Women SHGs have produced 22.05 lakh quintal vermi-compost, over 5.50 lakh quintal super compost, and 0.18 lakh quintal super compost plus from the cow dung purchased under this scheme. So far 20 lakh quintal compost has been already sold.

Power & natural paint from cow dung

In Gauthans, electricity is being generated from purchased cow dung. To produce natural paint from cow dung, an MOU has been signed between Kumarappa National Paper Institute Jaipur, MSME Board of the Government of India, and the Chhattisgarh Rajya Gau Seva Aayog (Chhattisgarh State Cow Service Commission).

Chhattisgarh Government is also setting up pulse and oil mills in Gauthans. In the first phase, pulse mills are being set up in 197 Gauthans and oil mills in 161 Gauthans.

A scheme for entrepreneurs

Kaushalya Patel a resident of Gharghoda in Raigarh district of Chhattisgarh is a house wife who has turned into an entrepreneur, thanks to the scheme launched by Chhattisgarh government headed by Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel.

Recently while interacting with the Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel during the state wide mega public relation campaign Bhent Mulakat she informed the Chief Minister that in her village the work of producing vermi-compost from cow dung was in full swing.

Kaushalya's self help group (SHG) has produced over 900 quintal of vermi-compost from cow dung and they have received a dividend of Rs 3.50 lakh.

She further said that the income generated from selling vermi-compost was being invested in vegetable farming.

“We have also installed a flour mill. We purchase wheat for Rs 15 per kg and are selling flour for Rs 30 per kg,” she told Chief Minister. Kaushalya requested the Chief Minister to introduce new women centric scheme.

After listening Kaushalya's story the Chief Minister suggested her to install a cold press oil mill and generate income from mustard oil as well.

Godhan Nyay Yojana has become as a source of reliable income and cottage industry as envisioned by father of nation Mahatma Gandhi.

State govt. begins 'Gaumutra' procurement

The Chhattisgarh government is purchasing 'gaumutra' (cow urine) from farmers in the state. Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel had launched the Gaumutra purchase scheme on July 28 this year.


This is the first-of-its-kind scheme in the country, under which cow urine is being purchased at the rate of Rs 4 per kg from the cattle rearers. The cow urine purchased under this scheme is used to make pest control product Bramhastra and 'Jeevamrut' (liquid organic fertilizer). The move is aimed at minimizing use of expensive chemical pesticides

and promoting organic farming.

In addition, it also aims to minimize residue of chemical pesticides in food items which destroys its nutritional value and cause harmful effects on human health.

Agricultural scientists suggest that cow urine insecticide is a superior and cheaper alternative to chemical pesticides. Its disease resistance is much higher than chemical pesticides. These pesticides are effective against leaf eating, fruit piercing and stem borer pests.

**Improving water level, cattle management, organic
compost production & backyard farming**



Suraji Gaon Yojana

Narwa Garwa Ghurwa Aur Bari

Suraji Gaon Yojana' comprises of four pillars namely Narwa (Water Conservation), Garwa (Livestock Management), Ghurwa (organic compost) and Badi (Backyard Farming) that aims to promote rural sustainable living along with environmental conservation and up gradation.

The objective of 'Suraji Gaon Yojana' is to bring villages to the centre of the state's economy by preserving and utilizing traditional resources available in rural regions. This scheme has significantly contributed towards the development of rural economy by increasing the income of rural farmers and populace.

Narwa

The Narwa Program is focused on rainwater conservation along with regulating and recharging groundwater levels. Along with maintaining the groundwater levels and proper channeling of water for irrigation, Narwa program also ensures the availability of water in summer season.

State government has identified over 28,000 drains for water treatment. Panchayat and rural development department is working on 8896 drains. Likewise, state forest department is working on 3460 drains while agriculture department working to improve water level of 387 drains.

Garwa

Garwa in Chhattisgarhi language means 'cattle'. Chhattisgarh is an agriculture-centric state and livestock plays a significant role in the rural economy. Garwa component of this scheme aims at conserving and promoting livestock-based income at the same time

providing day care for the animals.

For this, Gauthan day shelters have been established throughout the state to provide free-of-cost shelter, fodder, and water for livestock.






Ghurwa

The Ghurwa component in this scheme is focused on preparing organic compost from agricultural and livestock waste to curtail

the use of chemical fertilizers. It also aims to maintain soil fertility, increase organic farming yield with increasing of the farming income.



Bari

This initiative promotes the traditional practice of Backyard Farming which aims to cultivate organic produce and is used for Rural Sustainance while ensuring availability of nutrient-

rich food in the rural areas for self consumption. These farm-fresh fruits and vegetables are also being sold by the rural farmers for additional income.

Promoting agro forestry and timber plantation

Mukhyamantri Vriksha- ropan Protsaahan Yojana

This scheme is focused on promoting private farmers to grow timber-non timber species of trees on government office/gram Panchayat land for commercial/industrial plantation.

It is not only helping in combating the adverse effects of climate change but also assisting to boost the farmers' income.

This scheme simplifies the rules of tree felling on private land and promotes tree plantation on private and community lands. It aims at gradually reducing the timber imports.

This scheme is a step towards keeping the forests safe by reducing the pressure of taking woods from forest. It is helping in maintaining the depleting water level. Also it is helpful in meeting the industrial timber requirement.

It was launched on June 1, 2021.

All citizens of Chhattisgarh, all Gram Panchayats and Joint Forest Management Committees are eligible to take the benefit of the scheme.

Scheme Provisions-

The scheme aims to promote large scale plantation of timber, non-timber fruit-bearing plants, bamboo and medicinal plants in non-forested areas. Also the scheme wants to encourage agro-forestry on forest/revenue lands where land lease has been handed over to residents under Forest Right Act.

Plantation by Gram Panchayat-

If commercial plantation is done by a Gram Panchayat in community and non-forest areas using the fund available with the Gram Panchayat, then one year after the success of plantation, state government will provide an incentive of Rs 10,000 per acer to the Gram Panchayat.

If the farmers who have taken paddy crop in Kharif year 2020, plants trees in their farm in place of paddy, then they will be get incentive at the rate of Rs. 10,000 per acre per year for next 3 years.



Plantation by Joint Forest Management Committee-


If commercial tree plantation is done on the revenue land from the funds available with Joint Forest Management Committees (JFMC), then the concerned JFMC will get incentive at the rate of Rs 10,000 per acre after one year of successful plantation. The right to cut and sell the trees will be with the concerned JFMC.

Implementation of plan-

Plantation will happen in non-forest areas. Already running schemes like 'Hariyali Prasar Yojana', Chief

Minister's Bamboo Development Scheme will be further strengthened the plantation drive.

If 80 per cent of the planted saplings are found alive in inspection of the plantation one year later (generally carried out in month of April) then this plantation will be considered successful and incentive of Rs.10, 000- (ten thousand) per acre will be paid through DBT by the Divisional Forest Officer. The payment will be made in the account of the Joint Forest Management Committee concerned. The incentive amount will be paid from the budget item fixed by the government.





FREE English medium education in Government schools with world class infrastructure

Swami Atmanand Govt. Excellent School : SAGES

With the intention of providing best quality education with state-of-art facilities to under privileged children for free, Swami Atmanand Government Excellent (English Medium) School (SAGES) was launched.

SAGES began with 52 schools in July 2020 and it was well received across state. These schools were equipped with good infrastructure, qualified teachers, modern amenities, libraries, computer labs, language labs and many more things. By Dec 2022 Chhattisgarh had 279 SAGES including 32 Hindi medium Swami Atmanand Excellent Schools wherein 2.52 lakh students are studying. Also, 32 similar Hindi Medium schools are running in the state.

SAGES is part of Chhattisgarh government's initiative of 'Transforming Chhattisgarh'. Chief Minister Mr. Bhupesh Baghel's vision behind this scheme is to establish educational institutions in Chhattisgarh that have excellent facilities at par with private schools, and are accessible and affordable for the parents of economically weaker sections

The school was named after Swami Atmanand who was a great personality of Chhattisgarh. Swamiji had created awareness on importance of education in tribal areas. Swami ji's teachings and messages has reached every nook and corner of Chhattisgarh today, all thanks to the efforts of Chief Minister Mr. Bhupesh Baghel.

SAGES student in 'NASA Citizen Science Project'

Ritika Dhruv, a 16-year-old student from Mahasamund district of Chhattisgarh, was selected by the USA space agency 'NASA' for its Citizen Science Project. Ritika gave a presentation on the sound coming from black holes in space, which impressed the scientists of IIT Bombay and Satish Dhawan Space Center, Andhra Pradesh. Ritika is a class 11 student of Swami Atmanand Government Excellent (English Medium) School located at Nayapara village in the district. She participated in NASA's Asteroid Search Program, and was selected.




Ram Van Gaman Path

This is one of the most ambitious projects of Chhattisgarh government. It is believed that 10 out of 14 years of lord Ram's exile were spent in the jungle of Dandakaranya now known as Chhattisgarh.

The 2226 km long 'Ram Van Gaman Path' is being developed for which budget of Rs 137.45 crore has been sanctioned. 'Ram Van Gaman Path' beginning from Surguja district in northern Chhattisgarh traversing through the state culminates in Sukma district. There are series of remains along this path that reminds us of the once great civilizations that thrived here. These reminiscent are also a source of traditional believes.

Ram Van Gaman Path is a project to unify the remains of old civilizations. About 75 places connected with Lord Shri Ram have been indentified under this project. In its first phase Sitamadhi Harchoka, Ramgarh, Shivrinarayan, Turturia, Chandkhuri, Rajim, Shaptrishi Ashram, Jagdalpur and Ramaram are being covered.

This project in its every step will remind devotees of Lord Shri Ram. The beautification works at Chandkhuri and Shivrinarayan have been finished. Both the projects were dedicated to public. Champaran situated near Raipur has also been included in Ram Van Gaman Path.

Tendu Patta and Forest Produce Procurement

Chhattisgarh ranks first in procurement of minor forest produce on minimum support price across India. Chhattisgarh has identified millets as minor forest produce and has procured about 55,000 quintals of Kodo, Kutki and Ragi worth about Rs 17 crore.

The millets were purchased on support price from about 12,000 farmers through primary forest committees.

121 kinds of herbal products are being manufactured under the registered brand name of Chhattisgarh Herbals' under 139 Van Dhan Vikas Kendras of the state. The price of standard Tendupatta sack has been increased from

Rs 2,500 to Rs 4,000 per bag. State government has identified Lac farming as a form of agriculture and has decided to provide interest free loan for Lac farming.

This decision is going to benefit about 50,000 farmers. For taking care of tendu leaves collector, state government has launched Shaheed Mahendra Karma Tendupatta Sangrahaak Samajik Suraksha Yojana.


Under the scheme if tendu leave collector suffers any unfortunate incidents leading to death, total or partial disability then they will be given financial assistance.


Implementation of Forest Rights Act

Chhattisgarh is a tribal dominated state, so the state government led by Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel understands the need for implementation of Forest Rights Act.

The members of scheduled tribes living on forest land before December 12, 2005 and other traditional forest residents who have been residents for three generations (75 years) on any land are eligible for the use of occupied forest land for livelihood. Chhattisgarh is a leading state in the implementation of forest land rights.

The state government has implemented a scheme of planting medicinal and fruit bearing trees. People living in forests and farm-land famers are part of this scheme so that they could have additional or permanent source of income.

Thus, 5.05 lakh forest right letters have been distributed, which is over 97.63 lakh acres of land. Of the total letters provided to beneficiaries 4.55 lakh were individual forest right letters. In the same way 45,934 community forest right letters were also provided

Rajiv Gandhi Gramin Bhoomiheen Krishi Mazdoor Nyay Yojana

This scheme aims to provide financial assistance to landless farmer families in the rural areas of the state. Those connected with the Mahatma Gandhi NREGA or agricultural labor, washer men, barbers, blacksmiths, priests and other workers failing in unorganized sector are also eligible to take the benefit of the scheme.

Chhattisgarh is the first state in India to start such scheme. This scheme intends to take care of farmers and farm laborers who do not have land but are dependent on agriculture

or labor for earning their income. The scheme was launched in September 2021 and has gathered enormous response. Around 10 lakh people have received the benefits of this scheme.

This scheme is the brainchild of Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel who has also launched several farmers friendly schemes in the state like Narwa Garwa Ghurwa Bari, Rajiv Gandhi Kisan Nyay Yojana, Godhan Nyay Yojana and several others.

Free treatment for urban financially weaker people at their door




Mukhyamantri Shahri Slum Swasthya Yojana

Financially disadvantaged urban population living in slums had to bear hefty bills to get good medical facilities. To solve this problem, 'Mukhyamantri Shahri Slum Swasthya Yojana' (Chief Minister Urban Slum Health Scheme) was launched.

Under this scheme, the Mobile Medical Units (MMUs) visits slums and provides free-of-cost health check-up, treatment and medicine facilities to people living there. This is a great time and money saver as people get free medical facility at their doorstep. It was launch on 01 November , 2020.

Currently 120 MMUs have been deployed in urban slums across Chhattisgarh.

So far more than 52,892 camps were organized wherein more than 36.76 lakh patients were treated. Also various medical tests of 9.18 lakh patients were conducted and free of cost medicines was provided to 33.65 lakh patients. Considering the overwhelming response of scheme it has been extended to 14 Municipal Corporation, 43 Municipal councils and 111 Nagar Panchayats.

Mukhyamantri Haat Bazar Clinic Yojana

Providing quality healthcare facilities to people living in remote and inaccessible areas was the aim of Mukhyamantri Haat Bazar Clinic.


The scheme was launched on October 2, 2019 on the 150th anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi.

This scheme has turned out a major relief for Tribal people living in forested pockets of Bastar and Surguja region. As these people live in jungle it is not easy for them to reach to good hospital for through treatment of any small ailment. It has been noticed that over period of time this small ailment turns severe and at times is life threatening.

Haat Bazar (weekly market) has a very important role in lives of Tribal people. People from remotest place come to Haat Bazar for getting daily use item supply. So Mobile Medical Units (MMUs) are deployed in weekly market.

This scheme has come as a relief for large numbers of people. So far over 82 lakh patients have been benefited through these clinics. It has been noticed that after Haat Bazar scheme was launched the maternal and infant mortality rate in remote regions has also decreased.

Haat Bazar scheme has also given major boost to Malaria-Free Bastar campaign.





Women's health top priority: 1.43 lakh get free treatment

Dai-Didi Clinic

Dai-Didi Clinic is the first-of-its-kind scheme in the country providing free health services exclusively to women and adolescent girls living in urban slum across Chhattisgarh.

Dai-Didi is a Chhattisgarhi word that means mother and sister. This is a special scheme focused only on women and adolescent girls.

The Mobile Medical Units (MMUs) deployed under this scheme are well equipped with medical facilities and medicine. Also the MMU has all women staff including the doctor and nursing staff. The scheme was launched on November, 19, 2020.

At present, one clinic each is operating in Raipur, Bhilai and Bilaspur Municipal Corporations under the Chief Minister Urban Slum Health Scheme.

So far 01.43 lakh women living in urban slum have taken the benefit of this scheme.

This scheme has come as a major relief particularly for adolescent girls who due to shy nature avoided going hospital with small complications. MMU is also making girls aware of menstrual hygiene. Being an all women unit, women do not hesitate in talking with the doctor and sharing their health problems.

Shree Dhanwantri Generic Medical Store Yojana

This scheme was launched to provide low price medicines to the residents of state. 'Shree Dhanwantri Generic Medical Store' scheme was launched on October 20, 2021. Under this scheme, generic medical stores have been established in the urban areas of the state.

In these stores medicines are available at

discount of 50 to 70 per cent less on the Maximum Retail Price (MRP).

It is mandatory to sell 251 types of generic medicines and 27 surgical products in these medical stores. Apart from this, products of Sanjeevani of Forest Department, cosmetics products and baby food are also being sold in here.

2.65 Lakh children freed of malnutrition so far

Mukhyamantri Suposhan Abhiyan

Mukhyamantri Suposhan Abhiyan was launched by Chhattisgarh government to ensure holistic nutrition for the children.

The state government is determined to run this campaign until every malnourished child in the state receives proper nutrition. Merely distributing rice and cereals cannot help in effectively combating malnutrition. Therefore, the Mukhyamantri Suposhan Abhiyan (Chief Minister Nutrition Campaign) was launched to free the state from malnutrition.

'Mukhyamantri Suposhan Abhiyan' was launched on October 2, 2019 on the occasion of birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi.

When this scheme was launched, Chhattisgarh had approx 4.92 lakh malnourished children.

Also under this program over 1 lakh women

have been freed from anaemia.

With convergence of various schemes like Mukhyamantri Bal Sandarbh Yojana, Vajan Tihar, Nava Jatan and Mukhyamantri Suposhan Abhiyan in past four years 2.65 Lakh children were freed of malnutrition .

During the COVID pandemic lockdown 25 lakh beneficiaries registered in 51,455 Anganwadis across state had received home delivery of ready-to-eat food.

As per National Family Survey - 5, the malnutrition rate in Chhattisgarh is 31.30 per cent which is lower than the national malnutrition rate of 32.10 percent. Under this scheme iron and folic acid supplements were provided to anaemic patients.

Chhattisgarh Rojgar Mission

This scheme was created to generate additional employment opportunities for the youth in Chhattisgarh.

To compile all efforts of various livelihood and beneficiary oriented schemes and to create new opportunities for employment, the Chhattisgarh Employment Mission was launched. To connect the people of the state with economic activities and to help economic empowerment of the residents of Chhattisgarh is one of the main aims of this mission.

Under the mission, the Government is aiming to create about 10-15 Lakh employment opportunities in the next 5 years.

The mission also aims to establish the popularity of the brand Chhattisgarh nationwide. Under the mission, exhibitions displaying the most prominent products of the state have been held in metropolitan cities like Delhi, Mumbai, Bengaluru, etc. Stalls selling the Chhattisgarh's home grown products have been established in the airport. Special promotional campaigns will be conducted for boosting the sales of Kosa products and encouraging tourism opportunities.

The Employment Mission also aims to conduct research to enhance the quality of Chhattisgarh products with the help of institutes like IITs, IIMs, and Agriculture University. It also intends to encourage new startups with loan facilities and marketing strategies.

Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel had launched the scheme on May 01, 2022, on the occasion of 'International Labor Day'.

Under 'Mukhyamantri Mitan Yojana' citizens

are getting domicile certificate, caste certificate, income certificate, document copy, non digitized (copy of land record etc.), death certificate, marriage registration certificate, birth certificate, shop and establishment registration, birth certificate correction, death certificate correction, marriage certificate correction, and other related citizen services.

To avail the benefits of this scheme interested person needs to call toll free number-14545. After the phone call, a Mitan comes to their house, collect the necessary documents, get the certificate made from the office concerned, and deliver it to the individual's doorstep.
